

SPAY OR NEUTER YOUR PET FOR \$20

CARE's Lillie's Fund is dedicated to providing low cost spay and neutering services for dogs and cats that are at least 3 months old. To qualify, you must be a **resident of Chatham County**,

AND

- Your annual household income is \$40,000 or less

OR

- You receive support from any of the programs listed on the next panel.

A \$20 co-pay for each dog/cat must be included with this application—this application will not be processed without it.

The co-pay amount (cost to you) is **\$20 for a cat** and **\$20 for a dog**. Puppies and kittens (four months old or less) can be fixed for **\$5 each** IF the mother is fixed at the same time.

If you are approved, you will receive a voucher and additional information. If you are not approved, your money will be returned to you.

Distemper and rabies shots (if needed) will be included along with pain medication for adult females. Rabies shots are required by law and will be given unless you provide proof of vaccination.

Spaying or Neutering is *Good* for you and Your Pet!

- Sterilized pets live longer, healthier lives.
- Sterilized pets make better pets, more affectionate companions and are less likely to roam or fight.
- Sterilized cats are less likely to spray and mark territory
- Unsterilized animals exhibit more behavior problems, and may be more likely to bite. Females in heat often cry incessantly and attract unwanted males.
- Sterilization reduces pet overpopulation and the number of unwanted animals killed in our animal shelters . . . 300,000 in North Carolina in 2006 alone.

Allow two cats and their offspring to breed for 10 years, and you'll produce 80,399,780 cats, assuming two litters per year and 2.8 surviving kittens per litter. Most of these cats will be killed in animal shelters because there just aren't enough homes for them all.
