

DO I QUALIFY FOR CARE'S LILLIE'S FUND?

You must be a resident of Chatham County to participate in Lillie's Fund.

You must own the dog or cat.*

Lillie's Fund is for residents who have no other options for financial assistance for pet spay/neuter.* Our funds are limited so it is important that we serve those who need our help the most.

Your annual household income must not exceed \$40,000.

HOW DO I SHOW THAT I QUALIFY FOR LILLIE'S FUND?

1. Enclose a copy of your own adult Medicaid card or Food Stamps card. (Medicaid and Food Stamps recipients automatically qualify.)
2. OR, enclose a copy (just the first page) of the last tax return of each adult in your household. (The total must not exceed \$40,000)
3. OR, if you qualify by current income but did not file taxes, your income has decreased since your last income tax return, you are unemployed, or prefer not to send your tax return, please enclose a letter of explanation and your best proof of eligibility. (W-2, check stubs, etc.)

HOW DO I USE LILLIE'S FUND?

1. Complete this application and send to:

2. Include a \$20 co-pay for each pet.

Puppies and kittens (four months old or less) can be fixed for \$5 each IF mom is spayed at the same time. (Your application will not be processed without your co-pays.)

3. Include proof of eligibility as explained on the panel to the left.

Your application will not be processed without proof of eligibility.

4. You will receive your vouchers by mail.

If you are not accepted in the program you will be notified and your co-pay returned. If you qualify, you will receive the voucher(s) within 3 weeks.

5. Call a participating vet for an appointment.

You will receive a list of participating vets with your voucher. Call to make your appointment as soon as possible. Vouchers are good for only 2 months. CARE recommends your pet be at least 3 months old to be spayed or neutered. If you think your pet may be pregnant, do not delay. Pregnant cats and dogs CAN be spayed. The vet can answer any questions you have about your pet's health.

6. Take your pet to the vet on a leash or in a carrier.

For everyone's safety, always use a leash or carrier. Distemper and rabies shots (if needed) will be included along with pain medication for adult females. Rabies shots are required by law and will be given unless you provide proof of rabies vaccination.
