Distemper and rabies shots (if needed) will be included along with pain medication for adult females. Rabies shots are required by law and will be given unless you provide proof of vaccination.

WHY IS CARE OFFERING THIS PROGRAM?

The statistics have shown that **as many as 30% of the dogs in shelters today are either Pit Bulls or Pit Bull mixes.** There are not enough homes for all these dogs and their offspring. If we reduce the breeding, we reduce the number of Pit Bulls and mixes from being abused, abandoned, and ending up in shelters.

CAN I GET MY PREGNANT FEMALE SPAYED?

Yes, with some few exceptions. Tell the vet your dog is pregnant when you make your appointment.

CAN I SPAY MY DOG IF SHE JUST HAD PUPPIES?

Yes. Talk to the vet about your options when you make your appointment.

I HAVE OTHER PETS THAT AREN'T PIT BULLS. HOW CAN CARE HELP?

CARE has a low-cost spay/neuter program called Lillie's Fund which provides low-cost spay/neuter services for a \$20 co-pay for qualifying Chatham County residents. Go to the CARE website and click any Spay/Neuter link.

WHY SHOULD I SPAY/NEUTER MY DOG?

Spaying and Neutering:

Greatly reduces by 98%, the risk of getting certain types of cancer and infections, especially of the urinary tract.

Makes pets more affectionate companions who are less likely to roam or fight.

Reduces unwanted behavior problems and the possibility of biting. And females in heat often cry incessantly and attract unwanted males.

Reduces pet overpopulation and the number of unwanted animals killed in shelters . . . **300,000 killed** in North Carolina in 2006 alone.
